## Making medicine and potions!

Why not have a go at making your own medicine like Princess Pearl and Gadabout the Great do in the story?

Use resources from around the kitchen (with adult supervision), or water mixed with food colouring. Do you think the medicine will taste nice or horrible? What colour do you think the medicine will be?

Could you make a potion outdoors using things from around the garden? Leaves, stones, petals, grass and mud are all fun to mix with water! Do you think a fairy might use the potion to make someone better whilst you are asleep?



## Making a model of Zog the dragon!

Could you make a model of Zog the dragon using resources from home such as blocks or lego?


Could you use anything from your craft pack? Could you use recyclable materials such as cereal boxes, yogurt pots, milk cartons and bottle tops?

Talk about what colour Zog is, how could you mix colours together to make the correct colour. What facial features he has (two eyes, nose, mouth, ears, a horn etc.). Talk about what Zog would feel like, how could you give his skin a scaly texture. Could you add string to Zog and hang him from the ceiling so it looks like he is flying around the room?



## Rhyming words!

Can you find the rhyming words in the story? Talk about words that rhyme. Can you make up new rhyming words to go with the ones in the story?
