Dear Parents,

Hello and welcome everyone, what a fantastic start to the new school year. All of the children are settling in to nursery life, enjoying their time with us and beginning to make good relationships with staff. We are so impressed with how easily the children have separated from their adults & entered nursery so calmly.

Well done to our returning children too, they have certainly come back so well and are enjoying making new friends.

Thank you to all adults for your support and patience with our entry & exit routines. The 'Drop & Go' procedures are quickening up as the children become familiar with the hand sanitizing on entry and the home collection is also quickening up as become more familiar with all of you. If you need to speak to a member of staff at drop off or collection, we ask if you can wait to one side and then once staff are free they will speak to you.

The Early Learner children are one big nursery class, where all staff work with all children, under the direction of myself and Mrs Wilson, our Deputy Headteacher. For organisation purposes the children are grouped into key worker groups; Miss Taylor, Mrs Waller, Mrs Richardson and Miss

Moore/Miss Tobin. Mrs Read supports children with additional needs.

Our initial learning theme this half term is "Early Days", giving children lots of opportunities to learn the routines & expectations of Early Learners as well as discovering lots of new learning experiences. We will soon upload some photographs to the school website and Class Dojo so you can see some of the lovely things the children have been doing.

Core Books

Over the year we will be sharing 'Core Books' with the children. The children will have opportunities to hear the stories read to them several times and take part in activities linked to the stories. Our core books this half term are "Where's Spot?", "Hide and Seek Pig" and "Touch and Feel Gruffalo".

Thank you to all who have paid their school fund money. Please can we ask













Social Media/ Networking Sites

As we all know Social networking sites such as Facebook and Twitter are now widely used. This type of media allows people to communicate in ways that were not previously possible. However, such sites can be inappropriately used by some as a means of expressing negative or offensive views about schools and their staff.



Although social networking sites may appear to be the quickest and easiest way to express frustrations or concerns about the School (and those associated with it), it is rarely appropriate to do so. Other channels, such as a private and confidential discussion with the School, or using the School's formal complaints process are much better suited to this.

The School considers the following examples to be inappropriate uses of social networking sites. (This list is non-exhaustive and intended to provide examples only):

- Making allegations about staff or pupils at the School/cyber-bullying;
- Making complaints about the School/staff at the School;
- Making defamatory statements about the School or staff at the School;
- Posting negative/offensive comments about specific pupils/staff at the School;
- Desting racist comments;
- Posting comments which threaten violence.

Please can we ask for your co-operation in following these guidelines when using Social media/ Networking sites.
